Drug, Alcohol and Smoking Policy

The IBF Australia acknowledges the social problems and health risks associated with drug and alcohol abuse and the addiction of smoking products. As a means of support to reduce the risks to the community the IBF Australia have a Drug, Alcohol and Smoking Policy.

This policy shall be binding on all officials, members and member clubs of the IBF Australia and members of the public who are attending IBF Australia events.

Illegal, Social and Performance Enhancing Drugs

The IBF Australia prohibits the use of illegal, social and performance enhancing drugs at any event sanctioned by the IBF Australia

Any member or members of the IBF Australia or the public who arrive at an event of the IBF Australia and are under the influence of any social or illegal drug will not be permitted access to the event or if their condition is realised after they have been allowed entry they will be removed by police.

If a player is removed from an IBF Australia competition for breaching the IBF Australia's Use of Illegal, Social or Performance Enhancing Drugs Policy will be immediately disqualified from the tournament and forfeit any tournament registration fee paid.

Any member found guilty of breaching this policy may be subject to a maximum penalty of a life ban.

Consumption of Alcohol

The IBF Australia does not hold a liquor licence and is not permitted to sell any alcoholic drinks and beverages.

The IBF Australia does not permit the consumption of alcohol during events sanctioned by the IBF Australia including at regular club training of affiliated clubs and meetings of the committee members of the IBF Australia

The IBF Australia will display a sign at the entry door of an event venue showing the words "Consumption of Alcohol at this event is not permitted"

Any member or members of the IBF Australia or the public who arrive at an event of the IBF Australia and are under the influence of alcohol will not be permitted access to the event or if their condition is realised after they have been allowed entry they will be asked to leave the event immediately or be removed by police.

If a player is removed from an IBF Australia competition for breaching the Consumption of Alcohol policy, they will be immediately disqualified from the tournament and forfeit any tournament registration fee paid.

Smoking

Smoking is strictly prohibited inside the premises of any event of the IBF Australia. The IBF Australia will display "No Smoking" signs at the entry door of the venue.

Any member or members of the IBF Australia or the public who breach the No Smoking Policy of the IBF Australia will be asked to leave the venue or be removed by the police.
